





I. THE PRE-REFORMATION CONDITION OF THE CHURCH

Roman Catholic Church had become a false church


BELGIC CONFESSION OF FAITH, Article 29

As for the false Church, she ascribes more power and authority to herself and her ordinances than to the Word of God, and will not submit herself to the yoke of Christ.

Neither does she administer the sacraments as appointed by Christ in his Word, but adds to and takes from them, as she thinks proper; she relieth more upon men than upon Christ; and persecutes those who live holily according to the Word of God, and rebuke her for her errors, covetousness, and idolatry.


Reformation needed because of "sacerdotalism."



The sacrament of penance required three acts on the part of the Christian. First, he must make an act of contrition. There must be genuine – if not perfect – sorrow for sin. Second, he must confess his sin orally to a priest. Third, he must perform some satisfaction or work to show his sorrow and indicate some payment for sin.



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Luther (1483-1546): Early Life & Spiritual Struggles







LUTHER: "The name of Christ frightened me, and when I looked on Him and the cross, He seemed to me like a flash of lightning. When people mentioned His name, I would rather have heard the devil mentioned. For I believed that I would have to do good works until they made Christ love and forgive me."

* "The righteousness of God" (Romans 1:17)

LUTHER: "The term caused me much trouble. It blocked the way for me. I hated the expression "righteousness of God," since I had been instructed by the usage and custom of all teachers to understand it according to scholastic philosophy as the "formal or active righteousness" in which God proves Himself righteous by punishing sinners and the unjust."

LUTHER: "These words, "the just" and "righteousness," were lightning and thunder in my conscience under the papacy, and merely hearing them mentioned terrified me."

Reformation in Luther's soul

LUTHER: "Then I felt as if I had been completely reborn and had entered Paradise itself through widely opened doors. Instantly all Scripture looked different to me."


"My conscience and spirit were lifted up, and I was made certain that it is the righteousness of God which justifies and saves us."

ENGELSMA: The Reformation was not about nice Popes and bad Popes, not about meat or fish on certain days, not about any of those superficial things that Rome lately has bestirred herself with. It was about salvation by God's grace in Jesus Christ alone! It was about Scripture, the only authority in the church and over the church!

LUTHER'S 95 THESES


- * #5 The Pope ... cannot remit any penalties other than those which he has imposed.
- * #21 Those preachers of indulgences are in error who say that by the pope's indulgences a man is freed from every penalty, and saved.
- * #32 They will be condemned eternally, together with their teachers, who believe themselves sure of their salvation because they have letters of pardon.
- * #36 Every truly repentant Christian has full remission of penalty and guilt, even without letters of pardon.
- * #62 The true treasure of the Church is the holy Gospel of the glory and the grace of God.

October 31, 1517 – Martin Luther nailed the 95 Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg




D. Engelsma: "The Reformation, therefore, was not Luther's intention, but the will of God. It was not Luther's achievement, but the work of God. Luther himself said, after the Reformation had sprouted and flowered: 'Like a blind mule I was led by Him.'"

Godfrey: "The 95 Theses mark the moment when Luther and the Reformation began a public, popular challenge to the medieval church. They are the beginning of the end of papal domination of the western church. They are the beginning of Luther's career as notable teacher of the Bible and reformer of the church. ... We see in them the goodness of God for the reform of his church."



Luther Acknowledged the Hand and Work of God




LUTHER: "God carried on this affair in a marvelous way and drove me into it without my intention, and He alone has advanced it so far that a reconciliation between the pope and us is impossible. ... Therefore may God help this cause. It is completely out of human hands."

LUTHER: "The die was cast; and so I did not want to do anything else than what I did. I began to put all my trust upon the Spirit who does not carry on a lazy business."

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
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JOHN CALVIN: 1509-1564




We Reformed people believe that the Reformation did not reach its maturity in Luther's theology but rather in that of John Calvin.


Calvin in Geneva – 1536-1564 (except 1538-1541)

CALVIN: "To hand on some elementary teaching by which anyone who has been touched by an interest in religion might be formed to true godliness."

Calvin's Theological Emphasis: The Glory of God

CALVIN:

- "There is no knowing that does not begin with knowing God."
- "A dog barks when his master is attacked. I would be a coward if I saw that God's truth is attacked and yet would remain silent."
- "God preordained, for his own glory and the display of His attributes of mercy and justice, a part of the human race, without any merit of their own, to eternal salvation, and another part, in just punishment of their sin, to eternal damnation."
