Church Membership For Reformed Believers Speech #1: THE OBLIGATION OF MEMBERSHIP IN A TRUE CHURCH

Introduction:

- 1. This is a significant subject for each child of God personally, for it bears directly on our salvation.
- 2. It is also significant because many professing Christians today are not members where they ought to be.

"The Obligation Of Membership In A True Church"

I. An Urgent Question


- A. Every sincere believer faces and asks a crucial question: "Which church should I be a member of?" We don't ask this question just once, but should always be conscious of it.
- B. The believer asks this question about the church as an institute.
 - 1. An instituted church is an organized congregation where Christ is acknowledged as Head. He is represented by officebearers. Believers and their children gather there to worship.
 - 2. The believer realizes he needs to be a member of such an institute. He does not say: "I'm a member of the universal body of Christ, and therefore I don't need to be in an institute."
 - 3. We need to be in an institute for our salvation. Belgic Confession, Art. 28: "This holy congregation is an assembly of those who are saved, and out of it there is no salvation!" Hebrews 10:25.
- C. This question is urgent.
 - Many religious institutions exist that call themselves churches and claim to be true churches of Christ.
 - 2. Many false churches exist something we can expect to increase as the end of time approaches.

II. The Identifying Marks

- A. This question is answered by means of the Three Marks of the Church!
 - The marks are identifying characteristics, by which we can easily recognize a true church of Christ.
 - 2. We know what they are because the Spirit has led the church into the truth. John 16:13-14.
 - 3. They are stated in the Belgic Confession, Art. 29. Also in the Westminster Confession, Ch. 25.4.
- B. The first mark: "Is the pure doctrine of the gospel preached there?"
 - 1. Scriptures Matt. 16:18, John 10:5, 27-28, Eph. 4:11-12, I Tim. 3:15, II Tim. 4:1-2.
 - 2. This is the main mark. The other two are dependent on it.
 - 3. The true church (1) preaches "pure" doctrine; (2) preaches the "gospel"; (3) is a "preaching" church.
 - 4. The child of God needs this, and needs to be in the church that does this. John 10:27.
- C. The second mark: "Does this church purely administer the sacraments as Christ commanded?"
 - 1. Scriptures Matt. 28:19, Mk. 10:14-15, Acts 16:15, Matt. 26:26-28, I Cor. 11:23ff.
 - 2. This involves administering only 2 sacraments, and using proper elements in the sacraments.
 - 3. It also involves having the proper candidates for Baptism, and for Lord's Supper (I Cor. 11:28-29).
 - 4. This mark has an important implication: Proper worship, as regulated by the Scriptures (John 4:24).
 - 5. The child of God needs to be a member in such a church because the sacraments are means of grace.
- D. The third mark: "Is church discipline exercised in punishing of sin?"
 - 1. Scriptures: Matt. 16:19, Matt. 18:15-18, I Cor. 5:11, Titus 3:10.
 - 2. The true church disciplines for errors in life and errors in doctrine.
 - 3. This discipline always begins through the sound preaching of the Word of God. II Cor. 2:15-16.
 - 4. This mark has an important implication: Proper Church Government.
 - 5. The child of God needs to be in such a church, for there Christ is working, through the elders, to preserve His people in holiness and to restore those who stray.

III. The Application Of This Truth

- A. The marks are easy to use.
 - 1. It is easy to understand and remember what these three marks are.
 - 2. It is easy to apply the marks because they are objective (not subjective).
- B. We must use them to determine our church membership.
 - 1. This clearly implies not using other supposed marks/criteria: such as the lives of the members, personal preferences with regard to worship or church activities, the minister, location, etc.
 - 2. We may never join a false church. And if one is in a church that is false or apostatizing, after striving to reform/correct it, he/she must seek and join a true church.
 - 3. There is no pure church on earth. Christ calls us to be members of the church that most clearly manifests the three marks.



- C. This is a most serious matter.
 - 1. Membership in a church has to do with being either near to, or far away from, Christ.
 - 2. Proper membership is crucial for your own salvation, and for the salvation of your children, etc.
- D. Be thankful for the true church and cherish her and membership in her above all earthly good (Psalm 27:4).
